<b>ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORY/BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH</b>	Stanley Davies (1909-1994) came to Powell River in the 1930s. Davies was working on the boats that came to Powell River and when his brother Fred moved to Powell River, Stan and his other brother, Hector, moved as well. Stan then worked in the Powell River Company garage. He was involved with the local air raid patrol during WW II. He became a fireman and in 1946 he was appointed the Powell River Company Fire Chief. He held that position until 1976. Davies was also active in the BC Fire Chiefs Association. His only child, Gordon, predeceased him, and his wife Kathleen died in 1998.
